- All vessels must comply with the MAST offshore safety requirements
- Current photo of vessel
- Copy of current insurance policy

Entry cost

- Adult Anglers \$50.00 each
- Junior & Small Fry Anglers \$20.00

Entry requirements

- All team members must be current members of a club affiliated with the Game Fishing Association of Australia
- All contest fees must be paid, in full prior to Friday nights briefing
- One team per boat
- A team must consist of at least 2, and a maximum of 6 anglers, Inc. the skipper

Contest rules

- Rod & Range Sports Peninsula Challenge is a TGFA sanctioned contest, fished under GFAA & TGFA rules
- Target species:
 - Broadbill Swordfish
 - Other Bill fish
 - Southern Bluefin, Yellowfin & Albacore tuna
 - Shark tag only, no sharks will be weighed in this contest
- Tasmanian recreational fishing rules apply
- All fish to be weighed must equal or exceed the line class used to capture them.
 - To be eligible, Bill fish must be a min. weight of 60kg

Daily capture limits

• To comply with fisheries & TGFA requirements are:

- Each angler can weigh a combined max. of 2 fish
- Each team can weigh a combined max. of 4 fish
 - Exceptions to this:
 - Each team can weigh a max. of 1 x billfish
 - Each team can weigh a max. of 2 x SBT over 1.5m

Point scoring system for captures, is as per the TGFA regulations

- Fish weight x 100 x fighting factor divided by line class
- Fighting factors for capture calculations
 - All tuna 1.5
 - All Marlin 1.2
 - Broadbill Swordfish 2.2

• Tag and Release

- As per attached TGFA Guidelines
- Tags will be available at the briefings & weigh ins
 - Only contest issued tags will count
 - Tags must be returned immediately after the contest
 - All tags require a \$50 deposit refundable upon return of tags or completed tag cards

Rods & Line class

- Any number of rods may be fished, but only 5 fish may be played at a time
- Only rods picked up immediately after strike are eligible
- Min. line class 2kg
- Max. line class 60kg

Fishing Boundaries

- Contest boundaries are the perimeter of the grip map supplied
- THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS
 - If you hook up inside the map, but move outside the map fighting a fish you will be disqualified from the contest

• Special Permissions - Fishing Times

Any angler fighting a fish at the 3pm end of fishing time, may request permission to continue to fight the fish from the contest committee

Bait Collection

 Live bait may be collected before fishing start, provided it is within eyesight of the Tuna Club of Tasmania club rooms

Radio skeds

- Competition control will be on VHF Channel 73
- All vessels must carry a working VHF Marine radio
 - It is recommended that along with the your vessels VHF radio, all teams also carry a hand held VHF radio
 - If your VHF fails, you must return to Pirates Bay immediately
- Each skipper is responsible for making sure their team checks in on radio skeds
 - All vessels must report on every sked
 - If contact is not made during the sked, please wait until the end of the sked
 & comp control will attempt to contact you again via Tas maritime radio
 - Failure to report on 2 consecutive skeds will result in the TGFA emergency procedure been instigated - Attached
 - All vessels are required to log on prior to leaving Pirates Bay, with the following details:
 - Boat/team number
 - Number of Persons On Board Adults, juniors/small fry
- Radio skeds will be conducted at ten past the hour, every hour from 7.10am –
 3.10pm
 - Each sked you will be required to provide the following:
 - Boat/team number
 - Grid map position using the phonetic alphabet, as printed on the grid map
 - "same position" will not be tolerated, & may result in disqualification
 - Number & species fish captured
 - Number & species of fish tagged & released
- On the 3.10pm final sked, you will be required to provide the following
 - ETA at Pirates Bay
 - Fish to be weighed
 - Tags to be counted
 - Once you return to Pirates Bay, you must log off for the day, please ensure you receive confirmation
 - Failure to log off will result in disqualification

Weighing of Fish

- The contest committee will appoint the weigh master(s)
- All fish will be weighed at the weigh station, at Pirates Bay Eaglehawk Neck
 - All fish to be presented gill & gutted or sashimi style
 - All fish must be cleaned at sea
 - Any team cleaning fish on the jetty or around the tuna clubrooms will be disqualified.
 - Fish being weighed for record purposes will be weighed whole, but will need to be represented gill & gutted for the contest.

- Tackle used must be presented & checked prior to weighing
 - If the tackle fails, the fish will not be weighed
- Score cards must be filled out completely prior to weighing
 - And be signed by the weigh master after weighing
- Tag cards must be filled out in full & time/date video footage or still photos
 of the tags with correct placement may be requested
 - Note: Min. size for tagging tuna is 60cm
 - Yellow tail kingfish is 70cm
- The weigh master(s) reserve the right to:
 - Check rods, reels & tackle, including gaffs, flying gaffs, tail ropes etc.
 - Test line class
- The committee reserves the right to:
 - Refuse weighing fish for an individual angler or team
 - Settle any disputes
 - Make decision or variations relating to the conduct of the contest
 - Place observers on any boat
- Protests must be lodged, in writing within 30 minutes of the close of fishing

Car parking, ramp etiquette, safety & use of public facilities

- Please remember we are all the public face of our sport in Tasmania
- The SFCT may have traffic controllers in place of to direct the flow of traffic
 - Their directions must be followed at all times
 - Be ready when you hit the ramp for a quick turn around
 - Head lights off
 - Bungs in
 - Straps off
 - · Batteries charged etc.

Parking

- Be courteous to the locals when parking
- Don't park over driveways, hanging half on the road or in no standing areas

Safety

- Follow all directions given
- Drink driving, remember 0.05 on the water as well as the road
- Anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated
- Offending persons or teams may be disqualified

Facilities

- The ramp, jetty, carpark & surrounding areas are public facilities, used by many other people, not just fisherman
- Follow all signage and rules around
 - Camping
 - Fires
 - Rubbish & fish waste

Directions if given by any other official person must be followed
